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A. Overview



- One of the Main Drivers of the Turkish Economy
 - Construction GDP of USD 31.6 bn in 2015. (Source: Turkish Statistical Institute, 2016)
 - Almost 185 thousand construction companies, most of them being SMEs. (Source: Social Security Institution, 2016)
 - Almost 1.8 mn employees. (Source: Social Security Institution, 2016)
 - **USD 2.2 bn** FDI inflow to the construction industry btw. 2011 and 2015. (Source: Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey, 2016)
 - **4,418** foreign companies are active in construction industry as of April 2016. (Source: Ministry of Economy, 2016)
 - Number of houses sold to foreigners continuously increased: 12,181 (2013), 18,959 (2014), 22,830 (2015). Most of the buyers were from Iraq, S.
 Arabia, Kuwait, Russia, UK and Germany in 2015, respectively. (Source: Turkish Statistical Institute, 2016)
 - Within the scope of urban renewal project of the government, **602,400** units of buildings are announced to be risky as of 2015 and planned to be renovated. (Source: Ministry of Environment and Urbanization & The Building Information Centre, 2016)



Production: Housing

- 123,221 buildings given construction permits in 2015.
- Due to elections in 2015, **housing supply decreased**, as the housing investors preferred to wait and see the economic developments.

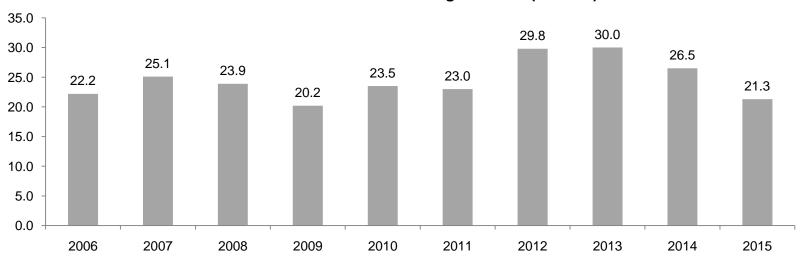

International Projects

- Turkish companies have been active particularly in Russia, Turkmenistan, Libya, Iraq, Kazakhstan, S.
 Arabia, Algeria, Qatar, Azerbaijan and other nearby countries.
- Total international project volume btw. 1972 March 2016 is USD 325.4 bn.
- **Btw. 2010-2015**, main projects were highways/bridges/tunnels (14.5%), residences (11.7%), airports (8.9%), office buildings (8.3%) and power plants (6.7%).
- Due to the **political instability** in the Middle East, particularly in Libya and Iraq, has negatively affected the volume in the recent period.

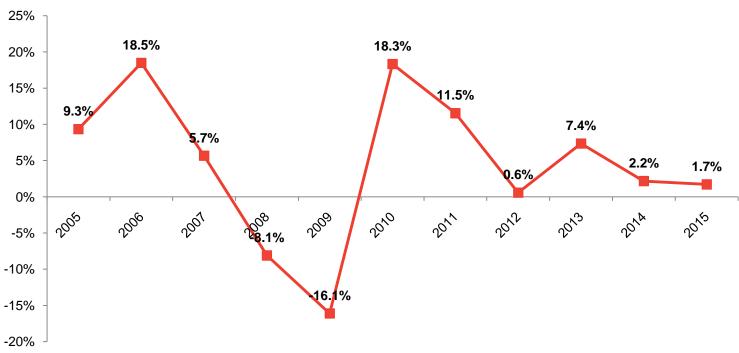

• Due to political uncertainties, the construction industry managed to grow only by **1.7%** in 2015.





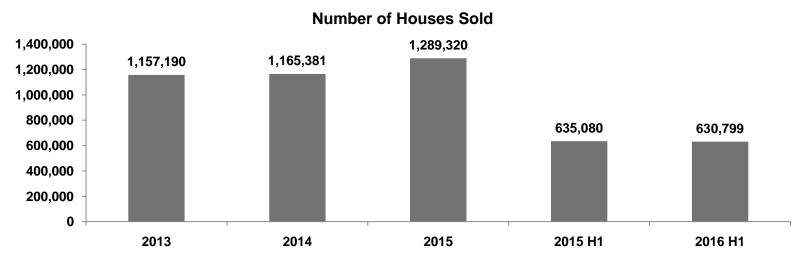
